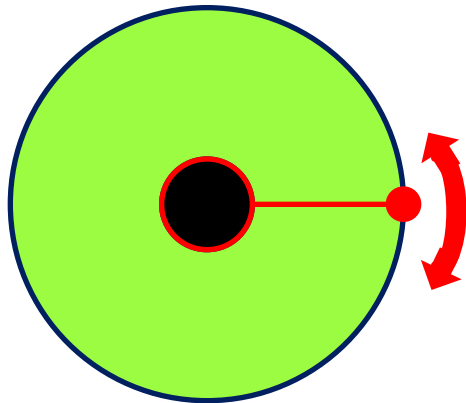


## UNI-Line® Implementation instructions

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## Example „tree’s ring“

Tree’s ring

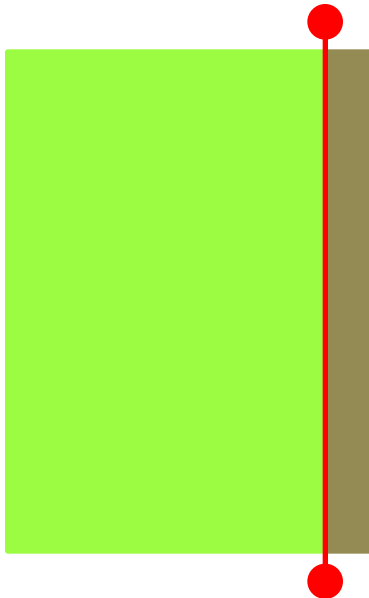


Take a cord with the length of your tree’s ring radius plus circumference of your tree, clipse cord around the tree keeping it moveable.

Clipse a wooden stick on the end of the cord, move around the tree and create a marking on the bottom. Then start again with digging ...

... dig – implement – ready!

## Example „Straight Line“



Strain a cord along your straight line, dig along with a straight digging tool (i.e. Gardena Digger) and widen up slightly the diggings done.



**Tip:** for uneven garden areas see last slide! Keep any stitch as small as possible (don't widen up too much). If possible then provide a slight tension on both ends of UNI-Line (valid for lengths up to 2 m).

## Implementation example



Implement your lawn edge in a way to keep it outside bottom maximally on cutting length of your grass. This will guarantee also that it will nearly optically „disappear“ after some few weeks.



**Tip:** keep a small slope from your lawn down to the separated area (stones, mulch, etc.).

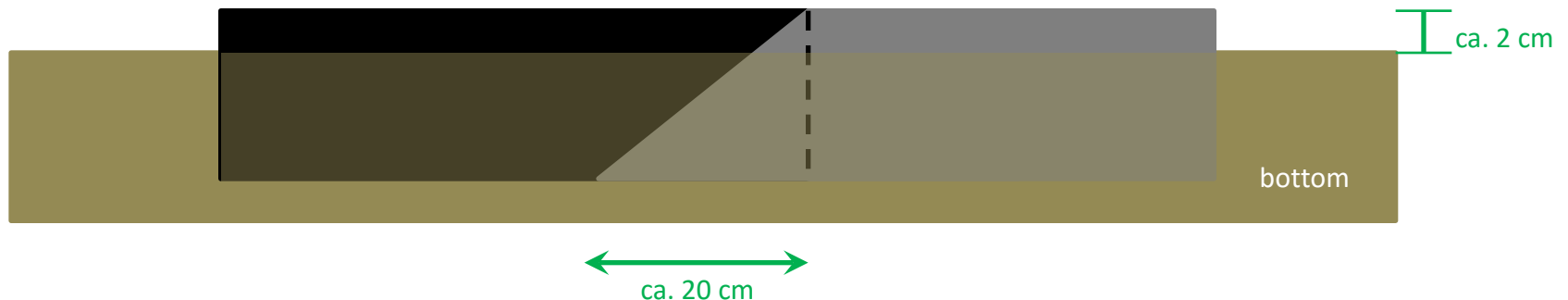


## Example „patch up“

When patching up two different lawn edges then keep an overlapping area of ca. 20 cm.



**Tip:** cut one edge top down in a ca. 45 ° angle, the other bottom up in the same way! This will guarantee good implementation over time and is not creating a double edging area!



## Example „unevennesses“

Just cut in your edge bottom up for ca. 8-9 cm, then bend it up- or downwards and keep it in line with your garden area.
